Throughout year 9 at Cydney's previous school, the academic cycle was revving up towards year 10 and the regimental delivery of the National GCSE Curriculum. Theoretical textbook based learning just wasn't suiting Cydney, but she always enjoyed the more hands-on approach. When Chris and Elaine heard more about the UTC principles, it ticked all the right boxes. They felt that if Cydney remained exposed to the one dimensional form of the National Curriculum, she would be marginalised, with the inevitable negative impact on her self-confidence, personal and social development.

Chris says: "Six months on and our hopes and expectations of the UTC are now plain to see in our daughter's renewed enthusiasm for learning. In The Watford UTC she is benefitting from a system that not only delivers the prospect of academic qualification, but the technical and practical application of that qualification beyond the classroom. The UTC ethos enables the student to have one foot placed firmly in their realistic teenage present, while the other strides confidently towards their promising young adult future. "
